# Haiti - Earthquake

SEPTEMBER 4TH, 2021

# **Timeline Highlights**

August 14, 2021

At 8:29 am, a magnitude 7.2 earthquake struck 3 departments on Haiti's southern coast, namely Nippes, South and Grand'Anse. This earthquake took place near Petit-Trou des Nippes and at a depth of 10 kilometers. The whole country felt the tremors.

The same day, TNC (UniQ project) released a first report based on the data collected earlier on the ground, to help optimize the limited resources and to guide the first rescue.

August 16, 2021

The risk of flooding and landslides increased after tropical storm Grace hit Haiti less than 2 days after the earthquake.

August 17, 2021

The Government declared a state of emergency for one month and 3 days of national mourning.

First Meeting of the task force and the committees. UniQ has urgently gathered its resources and decided on a support action with 5 axes, and an organizing committee has been set up for each axis as well as a coordination task force. TNC released a second report that highlights the most affected regions and communal sections.

August 18, 2021

TNC released a third report following the aftershocks that highlights the most affected regions and communal sections.

August 20, 2021

Second meeting of the task force and committees before deployment on the ground in connection with the TNC network which is represented at the departmental, communal and communal sections levels for a project of local roadmaps.

August 24, 2021 September 1st, 2021 4 delegations from Quisqueya University were deployed on the ground.

September 3rd, 2021

Third meeting of the task force and committees after returning from their first missions. Report. Brainstorming on what to do next.



# **UniQ Strategy**


# **3-phase strategy**

In this context, Quisqueya University has, since the earthquake of January 12, 2010 that completely destroyed its campus, a familiar experience in each of the 3 phases that characterize any post-earthquake period.

Relief	Recovery	Reconstruction
1 month	6 month	1 year

# 5 areas of intervention

In response to the earthquake of August 14, 2021, Quisqueya University has decided to act in 5 specific areas that fall within its competence and to share its experience in each of the three aforementioned phases. Each area is managed by a committee in charge of the programming of concrete actions, monitoring and evaluation.



# TNC local network support and roadmaps

TNC (Trase Nouvo Chimen) is a social project led by UniQ, which has representation in the departments, communes and communal sections and which produces local roadmaps. The initiative post-earthquake relies on both the roadmaps of the affected regions and the local human resources network of TNC.

# Map of the TNC network in the Great South showing the representatives (pillars)



# Mission: The "Rescue of Cultural Property"

The Cultural delegation composed mainly of specialists-curators from the Center for the Conservation of Cultural Property (CCC-UniQ) and the Director of the University's Library (BUniQ) has benefited from a small fund from the SmithSonian Institute.

**Objectives**: Mapping out damaged property (Churches, Vodou Temples, Monuments, Library) and secure the property in question whenever possible.

# Mission: "Infrastructure, earthquake resistant component"

The delegation is composed of engineers and architects, professors, graduate students from Quisqueya's Faculty of Engineering and Architecture and drivers. 11 members in 2 teams.

**Objectives:** initially, observation of ground movements, structures and damaged buildings. Location by GPS and photography work, including drones. Creation of a database for future interventions. Immediate 5-day scouting mission, especially in the regions near the epicenter.

GPS\*, sclerometer\*, pundit\*, bibs and helmets, drones \*provided by LNBTP

# **Observations / Interventions**

While damaged buildings in urban centers are mostly made of reinforced concrete, traditional houses in rural areas are made of lighter weight materials that for the most part did not withstand the August 14, 2021 earthquake without damage.

Several landslides occurred along the roads but also in entrenched places not accessible by vehicle and also in remote places not accessible by vehicles.

# **Guidelines for the Action Plan**

Earthquake engineering:

- Dissemination of the training modules in earthquake engineering for masons, foremen and engineers,
- Design of housing units cyclone and earthquake resistant,
- $\hbox{-} Promotion to local authorities for the application of construction standards,}\\$
- New training courses in construction site management.

# Mission: "Medical care"

The "Medical Care" delegation was composed of 9 doctors from P-A-P and 32 interns based at St Boniface Hospital in Fond des Blancs. This delegation has been set up for a longer period of time.

UniQ has also invested in the transformation of one of its Buses into a **Mobile Clinic**. It was also necessary to buy emergency medicines and kits.

# Places of intervention of the mission

Beaumont: 43 patients seen: 18 men and 25 women between 3 and 75 years old Chardonnières: 54 patients seen: 24 men et 30 women between 4 and 89 years old Les Anglais: 48 patients seen: 16 men and 34 women between 9 and 82 years old





# **Observations / Interventions**

Two weeks after the earthquake, the health response arrived a little late. The urgent cases had already been moved and the more critical cases unfortunately had already succumbed. The patients seen were mainly taken care of for healing or superinfected wounds, post-traumatic stress, chronic pathologies, infections, gastroenteric problems etc.









In general, the populations were satisfied with the aid provided, and thanked the Quisqueya University for its humanitarian actions. As the first team, we also did a job of recognition.





The people told us about their expectations, which was mainly aid for the reconstruction of destroyed houses and buildings.

# **Guidelines for the Action Plan**

- Mobile clinics in the most remote Sections Communales where medical services do not exist,
- Professional Development programs for nurses and local health workers,
- Working with the local traditional practitioners : survey of treatment methods, training.

# Mission: "Education and Psychology"

The "Education and Psychological" delegation is composed of 8 members including teachers from our Faculty of Education (FSED-UniQ) and child psychologists. Objectives: To help school-age children to enable them to return to school in September. Special care for children to manage the trauma caused by the disaster and the exceptional living conditions suddenly imposed on them. This psychological accompaniment will also take the form of socio-emotional learning and therapy through the arts. Inventory of schools damaged, especially in the Nippes by the earthquake.

# **Observations / Interventions**

Visit of schools in l'Asile (most of them totally destroyed)

Visit of the National School of Changieux (the only national school of this communal section of L'Asile located only 4 km from the epicenter of the earthquake)

Meeting with a delegation of teachers from UNNOEH

Lycée Philippe Guerrier des Cayes - meeting with the Departmental Director of Education of the SouthPort-à-Piment - meeting with a group of principals whose schools were damaged.









# **Guidelines for the Action Plan**

- 1. Children first:
  - a. Art Therapy,
  - b. Sport,
- c. Back to School Initiative : How to teach in a zero building environment?
- 2. Teacher's training in the most remote "sections communales": Mobile Units,
- 3. Mental Health Initiative.

Port-à-Piment - 320 students were gathered in the premises of the Jardin Vert School (preschool, 1st and 2nd AF) with whom we played cards, sang, ate and to whom we distributed school kits. Some parents confessed that they remembered the reopening of classes thanks to school kits which reminded them that after the earthquake, children's school life must continue.

# Mission : "Consolidation of local productive capacities"

A survey is underway via the UniQ incubator QE3 through our students from the far south to assess the SMEs impacted by the earthquake. A study is being conducted by our researchers to establish a real diagnosis of the impact of the earthquake on the local economy and to arrive at a series of recommendations to avoid that humanitarians work against the economy and think about the reconstruction phase.
